- Including "Enriching Locals"
- Selection criteria
 - Project approach
 - Target audience, feasibility and novelty of the proposed solution, tentative rundown
 - Project engagement
 - # of participated students, OUs, schools/organizations, reach to the public, participants' feedback
 - Project impact and sustainability
 - Track record of previous EA projects
- Tentative schedule

Normal Track

- · Announcement of grants: 1st Feb
- · Submission deadline: 18th Mar
- Notification of results: 30th Apr
- · Organizing activities: May Aug
- Reporting and claims for expenses: 1st Sep

Fast Track for IEEE Education Week

- Announcement of grants: 1st Feb
- Submission deadline: 17th Feb.
- · Notification of results: 24th Feb
- Organizing activities: Apr
- Reporting and claims for expenses: 1st Sep



Details of Project 2B

EA project development grant - Theme-based (SDG-related, Cross-Section, Learning Network) https://ea.ieeer10.org/theme-based-track/

- Grant mechanism similar to Project 2, with a dedicated focus
- SDG-related*
 - Reason: Respond to the demands of sustainability education and HQ's focus on climate change
 - Scope: EA development on SDGs 5 (Gender equality), 7 (Affordable and clean energy), 11 (Sustainable cities and communities), 13 (Climate action)
- Cross-Section
 - Reason: Promote collaboration between OUs
 - Requirement: Collaboration among (at least) three OUs
 - Special arrangements for Sections with less than six sub-OUs



Details of Projects 2A and 2B

Matching Funding Policy

General track (2A)

- Submission by the Council/Section/Subsection:
 - Face-to-Face or hybrid activities: A maximum of USD 600
 - Virtual Activities: A maximum of USD 300
- ▶ The funding is released based on the IEEE Region 10 Matching Fund Policy.
 - A Large Section's project (1501 members or more) will be supported with 50% of the total fund
 - A Medium Section's project (501 to 1501 members) will be supported with 70% of the total fund
 - A Small Section's project (less than 500 members) will be supported with 90% of the total fund
 - A Council's project will be supported with 90% of the total fund (i.e., maximum matching 360 USD)

Theme-based track (2B)

- Submission by the Council/Section/Subsection:
 - Face-to-Face or hybrid activities: A maximum of USD 800
 - Virtual Activities: A maximum of USD 400
- The funding is released based on the IEEE Region 10 Matching Fund Policy.
 - A Large Section's project (1501 members or more) will be supported with 50% of the total fund
 - A Medium Section's project (501 to 1501 members) will be supported with 70% of the total fund
 - A Small Section's project (less than 500 members) will be supported with 90% of the total fund
 - A Council's project will be supported with 90% of the total fund (i.e., maximum matching 540 USD)
 - A "Cross-Section" project will be supported with 80% of the total fund



Details of Projects 2A and 2B

Matching Funding Policy

- The following are <u>NOT</u> eligible for the matched funding provided by the R10 EAC (Tentative list; To be updated):
 - Travel and accommodation
 - Except for projects that require land transport from/to rural areas for participating in the project
 - Cash honorariums to guests
 - Cash awards to participants
 - Most for food and beverages
 - Up to 50% of the grant funds may be used for refreshments for participants in the event as a way to
 motivate participation and engagement.
- For items that are not eligible for the matched funding provided by R10 EAC, the project team should seek other funding sources

- Promote, facilitate and support submissions to IEEE EAB Awards from R10 OUs or members
- Establish objectives, evaluation criteria and judging panel for the R10 EA Awards
 - R10 EA Outstanding Group Award
 - R10 EA Outstanding Volunteer
 - R10 EA Award Schedule
 - Announcement: 1st April
 - Nomination Deadline: 17th May
 - Submission of Evaluation to Award Nomination Committee: 30th June
 - Approval of nomination: 1st August
